5.0	Reports and Operational Matters	
5.1	Maths presentation to Board	AH, ELT Curriculum Leader for Maths gave a presentation to Board, her previous school where she was head of Maths topped the state in Maths over several years. AH has reviewed our PATs data and NAPLAN and reviewed our strengths and weaknesses, ensuring assessment leads to action. Ongoing mentoring and mentoring. Recommendations have been made across each year level, including reading and understanding what the questions are asking, teach problem solving, times table practice, checking for understanding, incorporate these in to daily review tasks.
5.2	Science presentation to Board	DM, ELT Curriculum Leader for Science gave a presentation to Board, including goals for 2024. General promotion of Science and STEM, we've received a \$500 Science Week grant, Introduction of an Annual Science Fair in Week 4 Term 3, Investigative competition in Science and STEM for 2023 & 24, creating a "bank" of experts in our community, using PATS data; currently over 40% of students are performing highly in Science
5.3	On Entry presentation to Board	JW, ELT for school improvement planning, provided the Board with a review and analysis of on entry data, providing longitudinal connections between 2022 and 2023. The OEA is the first standardised assessment covering literacy and numeracy skills, linked to WA Curriculum. It informs us of where the students sit when they arrive at school and assists us with planning and providing students early access to remedial/extension groups. Data analysis has shown us what the problems are and how to create lessons to focus on problem areas – review of strength and weaknesses across literacy, reading, speaking and listening, numeracy. We are seeing similar trends across entry levels. The Board were shown how the Elastik Data tool works and how teachers can target smaller groups with explicit learning. The data is used to guide planning, enables target teaching, remedial groups and extension groups.
5.4	RAP presentation to Board	8M, ELT Curriculum Leader for Hass and Reconciliation Action Plan presented an update to Board. There is a general community appetite for cultural awareness and DoE have a system requirement for all schools to demonstrate cultural responsiveness. Our current Business Plan addresses the RAP in progress under the priority area relationships and partnerships. Our Business Plan includes a commitment to develop and implement a Reconciliation Action Plan to strengthen our cultural responsiveness. A RAP is a formal statement of commitment to
